COURSE TITLE

The United Nations Sustainable Development Goals: From Global to Local

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This virtual course seeks to educate teachers on the significant work of the United Nations and encourage the use of UN artifacts as classroom resources that engage students in the rigorous exploration of the 2030 UN Sustainable Development Agenda.

The course is made up of a three-part series of interactive workshops that provide inspiring strategies focused on localizing the important goals of the UN and connecting them with the inherent importance of educational travel across academic disciplines. Participants will not only understand the breadth of international affairs as carried out by the UN, they will have multiple opportunities for collaboration with other educators from different regions as they develop and implement SDG-based lesson plans of their own. Highlights will include an interactive meeting with UN Spokesperson for the Secretary-General, Stéphane Dujarric, and exposure to the rich capabilities of the MyDiplomat App and InnerView Platform, both viable pathways that facilitate college and career readiness, fostering individuals who are able to think analytically and communicate effectively.

- Connect their in-classroom lesson/unit plan to the importance of future educational travel with EF
